2. Make sure the TPMS (tire pressure monitoring system) light is OFF.
3. If you notice anything out of the ordinary, take the vehicle to the shop.

When to take the vehicle to the shop:

1. If you notice a slow leak in the tire and the pressure doesn't match the placard value.
2. The TPMS light is flashing or solid after the ignition is turned on.
3. If you need a tire rotation or new tires.

Vehicles have been sitting idle in driveways for months and it's likely that any travel this holiday weekend is the longest distance that has been driven. Don't wait, make sure your vehicle is ready for the road.
